

**Bible reading:
Hebrews 10 : 5 -10**

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⁵ Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said:

“Sacrifice and offering you did not desire,
but a body you prepared for me;

⁶ with burnt offerings and sin offerings
you were not pleased.

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⁷ Then I said, 'Here I am—it is written about me in the scroll—

I have come to do your will, my God.'"^[a]

⁸ First he said, "Sacrifices and offerings, burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not desire, nor were you pleased with them"—though they were offered in accordance with the law.

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⁹ Then he said, "Here I am, I have come to do your will." He sets aside the first to establish the second.

¹⁰ And by that will, we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Hebrews 10:5-10

First, knowing God is a matter of personal dealing

» Jesus came so that knowing him we may have a relationship with the Father in heaven. So he says:

“ My sheep listen to my voice , I know them, and they follow me.....I give them eternal” (John 10:27-28).

Second, knowing God is a matter of personal involvement

» Anyone who, on the basis of `religious experiences', says, “I know God”, but does not do what I command is a liar, and the truth is not in him”

(1 John 2:4, 9, 11, 3:6, 11, 4:20).

Conclusion: Jesus' words: “Here I am” is a calling to do his will
